- Monitor and review our performance to ensure delivery of this policy and continual improvement in our energy performance.

As part of our carbon management pillar, Powerday's energy management policy will be reviewed on the introduction of significant changes in the operations, introduction of new legislation or in response to changes in expectation by the industry.

Responsibility for this policy lies with the Joint Managing Directors. All Powerday employees have a duty to adhere to this policy.
